Rumors are going the usual rounds that she is to be her country's first full-fledged woman attache in the Soviet capital. If this is true—and you can take my word that it is—she will be the only woman in the diplomatic corps in Moscow, and one of the few official women diplomats in the world.

Her Washington friends, and they are many, will be sorry to see her go. Since she came here in April, 1940, she has made quite a place for herself in the Capital's social and official life. Appointed first as honorary attache of the embassy, she later was assigned to the public relations staff, and has
